

Version 2.4 Changes Affecting External Users

- 1) Opening a bankruptcy case as a Chapter 12 will be disallowed until such time as Congress reenacts Chapter 12.
- 2) When a creditor is searched upon filing a claim, the creditor's name is now the first item to appear on the line rather than the creditor ID number. The creditor search will no longer be case sensitive in that the application will ignore upper or lower case when finding creditors matching the name entered by the user.
- 3) The Cases Report has been modified so the user has two Output Format options called Formatted Display and Data Only. Formatted Display produces the traditional report. The Data Only option allows the user to save the selected data to a file instead. The Data Only option was developed as a way to save raw data in a different manner (pipe-delimited format).
- 4) The deadlines on the Claims Register for Proof of Claim and Government Proof of Claim now lists the most recent non-terminated deadline rather than the first non-terminated deadline. The creditor search on the Claims Register will no longer be case sensitive in that the application will ignore upper or lower case when finding creditors matching the name entered by the user.
- 5) On the Claims Activity Report, there was a line which stated "Last date to file:" but no date was displayed. The report now displays the most recent Proof of Claim and Government Proof of Claims deadlines that are not terminated or satisfied.
- 6) The U.S. Trustee will have access to "View 341 Calendar Entry" in the Automatic Assignment/Scheduling program.
- 7) The "free look" on the Notice of Electronic Filing has been modified so each recipient of the secondary e-mail receives one free look instead of just the first secondary recipient to open the pdf attachment. The time period of the free look has been decreased to 15 days.
- 8) When a trustee enters a Batch document that is set up to prompt a pdf document, the trustee can no longer bypass the screen but must submit a pdf document.
