




April through June 2010 Quarterly Case Processing Statistics



New Cases


During the second quarter of the calendar year 2010, the Court opened a total of 4,547 new cases. There were 3,901 cases filed in the Eastern division, 454 cases in the Southeastern division and 192 cases filed in the Northern division. The court reopened 108

additional cases. The new cases consisted of 3,360 Chapter 7 filings, 21 Chapter 11 filings, 1 Chapter 12 filing, and 1,165 cases filed under Chapter 13. There were no new cases filed under Chapter 9. The chart above indicates the percentage of new cases filed under each chapter. Additionally there were 115 new Adversary Proceedings, 1,494 motions to lift the automatic stay and 186 motions to avoid liens. The chart to the right indicates the number of new cases filed during the second quarter in each division, broken down by chapter.



Chapter 7 and Chapter 13 Filings

During the second quarter, 2010, there were 3,360 Chapter 7 petitions and 1,165 Chapter 13 petitions were filed with the Court. These figures constitute 73.90% and 25.62%, respectively, of the total number of new cases filed this quarter. For comparison purposes, in the second quarter of 2009, the Court received 3,095 new Chapter 7 petitions (75.70%) and 986 new Chapter 13 petitions (24.11%). The chart to the right indicates the filing figures for Chapter 7 and Chapter 13 cases for the second quarter of 2010 and the past two calendar years.



Case Closings

The Court closed 3,511 cases during the second quarter, 2010. Case terminations by division included 2,981 for the Eastern division, 404 for the Southeastern division, and 126 cases for the Northern division. The number of cases closed this quarter is greater than the number closed during the second quarter of 2009 when the Court closed 2,901 cases. The Court also closed 124 adversary proceedings during the second quarter, 2010.

Pending Caseload

The pending caseload at the end of the second quarter, 2010, was 16,391 cases, an increase of 1,144 cases from the first quarter, 2010. These 1,144 cases reflect a 7.50% increase in the pending caseload from last quarter when there were 15,247 cases pending. The chart below depicts the change in pending caseload over the previous four quarters. During that time, the number of pending cases increased by 13.00% (1,886 cases), or an average of 471 cases each quarter. The number of adversary proceedings pending decreased by 9 cases in the second quarter, 2010, leaving 234 cases pending.
