




April through June 2011, Quarterly Case Processing Statistics



additional cases. The new cases consisted of 3,232 Chapter 7 filings, 4 Chapter 11 filings, and 1,023 cases filed under Chapter 13. There were no new cases filed under any other chapter. The chart above indicates the percentage of new cases filed under each chapter. Additionally there were 129 new Adversary Proceedings, 1,199 motions to lift the automatic stay, and 124 motions to avoid liens. The chart to the right indicates the number of new cases filed during the second quarter in each division, broken down by chapter.


New Cases

During the second quarter of the calendar year 2011, the Court opened a total of 4,259 new cases. There were 3,790 cases filed in the Eastern division, 329 cases in the Southeastern division, and 140 cases filed in the Northern division. The court reopened 113



Chapter 7 and Chapter 13 Filings

During the second quarter, 2011, there were 3,232 Chapter 7 petitions and 1,023 Chapter 13 petitions were filed with the Court. These figures constitute 75.89% and 24.02%, respectively, of the total number of new cases filed this quarter. For comparison purposes, in the second quarter of 2010, the Court received 3,360 new Chapter 7 petitions (73.90%) and 1,165 new Chapter 13 petitions (25.26%). The chart to the right indicates the filing figures for Chapter 7 and Chapter 13 cases for the second quarter of 2011 and the past two calendar years.



Case Closings

The Court closed 3,257 cases during the second quarter, 2011. Case terminations by division included 2,807 for the Eastern division, 340 for the Southeastern division, and 110 cases for the Northern division. The number of cases closed this quarter is less than the number closed during the first quarter of 2011, when the Court closed 3,838 cases. The Court also closed 157 adversary proceedings during the second quarter, 2011.

Pending Caseload

The pending caseload at the end of the second quarter, 2011, was 17,415 cases, an increase of 1,115 cases from the first quarter, 2011. These 1,115 cases reflect a 6.84% increase in the pending caseload from last quarter when there were 16,300 cases pending. The chart below depicts the change in pending caseload over the previous four quarters. During that time, the number of pending cases increased by 4.84% (804 cases), or an average of 201 cases each quarter. The number of adversary proceedings pending decreased by 28 cases in the second quarter, 2011, leaving 214 cases pending.
