




April through June 2014, Quarterly Case Processing Statistics



New Cases


During the second quarter of the calendar year 2014, the Court opened a total of 3,233 new cases. There were 2,807 cases filed in the Eastern division, 321 cases in the Southeastern division and 105 cases filed in the Northern division. The court reopened 169

additional cases. The new cases consisted of 2,339 Chapter 7 filings, 14 Chapter 11 filings and 880 cases filed under Chapter 13. There were no new cases filed under Chapter 9, 12 or 15. The chart above indicates the percentage of new cases filed under each chapter. Additionally there were 74 new Adversary Proceedings, 946 motions to lift the automatic stay, and 160 motions to avoid liens. The chart to the right indicates the number of new cases filed during the second quarter in each division, broken down by chapter.



Chapter 7 and Chapter 13 Filings

During the second quarter, 2014, there were 2,339 Chapter 7 petitions and 880 Chapter 13 petitions were filed with the Court. These figures constitute 72.35% and 27.22%, respectively, of the total number of new cases filed this quarter. For comparison purposes, in the second quarter of 2013, the Court received 2,691 new Chapter 7 petitions (73.11%) and 986 new Chapter 13 petitions (26.79%). The chart to the right indicates the filing figures for Chapter 7 and Chapter 13 cases for the second quarter of 2014 and the past two calendar years.



Case Closings

The Court closed 3,337 cases during the second quarter, 2014. Case terminations by division included 2,946 for the Eastern division, 310 for the Southeastern division, and 81 cases for the Northern division. The number of cases closed this quarter is less than the number closed during the first quarter of 2014, when the Court closed 3,446 cases. The Court also closed 72 adversary proceedings during the second quarter, 2014.

Pending Caseload

The pending caseload at the end of the second quarter, 2014, was 16,047 cases, an increase of 66 cases from the first quarter, 2014. These 66 cases reflect a .41% increase in the pending caseload from last quarter when there were 15,981 cases pending. The chart below depicts the change in pending caseload over the previous four quarters. During that time, the number of pending cases decreased by 5.39% (915 cases), or an average of 228 cases each quarter. The number of adversary proceedings pending increased by 3 cases in the second quarter, 2014, leaving 118 cases pending.
