




April through June 2016, Quarterly Case Processing Statistics



New Cases


During the second quarter of the calendar year 2016, the Court opened a total of 2,892 new cases. There were 2,487 cases filed in the Eastern division, 309 cases in the Southeastern division and 96 cases filed in the Northern division. The court reopened 97

additional cases. The new cases consisted of 1,883 Chapter 7 filings, 162 Chapter 11 filings, 5 Chapter 12 filings and 842 cases filed under Chapter 13. There were no new cases filed under Chapter 9 or 15. The chart above indicates the percentage of new cases filed under each chapter. Additionally there were 59 new Adversary Proceedings, 976 motions to lift the automatic stay, and 159 motions to avoid liens. The chart to the right indicates the number of new cases filed during the second quarter in each division, broken down by chapter.



Chapter 7 and Chapter 13 Filings

During the second quarter, 2016, there were 1,883 Chapter 7 petitions and 842 Chapter 13 petitions were filed with the Court. These figures constitute 65.11% and 29.11%, respectively, of the total number of new cases filed this quarter. For comparison purposes, in the second quarter of 2015, the Court received 1,982 new Chapter 7 petitions (68.80%) and 893 new Chapter 13 petitions (31%). The chart to the right indicates the filing figures for Chapter 7 and Chapter 13 cases for the second quarter of 2016 and the past two calendar years.



Case Closings

The Court closed 2,573 cases during the second quarter, 2016. Case terminations by division included 2,260 for the Eastern division, 228 for the Southeastern division, and 85 cases for the Northern division. The number of cases closed this quarter is less than the number closed during the first quarter of 2016 when the Court closed 2,982 cases. The Court also closed 66 adversary proceedings during the second quarter, 2016.

Pending Caseload

The pending caseload at the end of the second quarter, 2016, was 14,108 cases, an increase of 416 cases from the first quarter, 2016. These 416 cases reflect a 3.04% increase in the pending caseload from last quarter when there were 13,692 cases pending. The chart below depicts the change in pending caseload over the previous four quarters. During that time, the number of pending cases decreased by 2.56% (370 cases), or an average of 92 cases each quarter. The number of adversary proceedings pending decreased by 6 cases in the second quarter, 2016, leaving 105 cases pending.
